### RPL

Question	Answer
What is RPL?	Recognition of prior learning (RPL) is a process by which <b>relevant skills, knowledge and competencies acquired</b> through formal, informal and non-formal means may be recognised towards <b>access</b> to a qualification at TUT or for <b>credits</b> (subject recognition) in a qualification.
Who can apply for RPL?	<p>Any person who meets the statutory (legal) requirements for studying at a higher education institution.</p> <p>Any person who has acquired the <b>relevant</b> skills, knowledge and competencies at the <b>required level</b> for the intended programme of study.</p>
What are the requirements for RPL?	Anyone who applies for RPL will be required to provide <b>documentary evidence of the prior learning</b> that is claimed.
Where must the student apply for RPL?	<p>Potential students should apply for RPL at the RPL Office (<b>Building 21, Room LG 46, Pretoria Campus</b>).</p> <p>Students must not complete RPL application forms</p>
What is the RPL application fee?	The application fee for RPL is <b>R260</b> (2012 fee) and students may also be required to pay <b>R500 per assessment</b> conducted.
How long does the RPL process take?	The RPL process may take up to six <b>months</b> to complete.
